The Honor of Dual Membership

Unique among our Post membership are dual members. Dual members are those who served our country <u>and</u> are part of a legacy of doing so. They have a family history of service through their father, mother, grandfather, uncle, etc. The American Legion states that "they are quite often an important link between the SAL and the American Legion Post…"

Being a member of the SAL is about honoring those that have served. Being a dual member is about giving a nod to those in your family that served before you. If you have this legacy of service in your family and do not belong to the SAL, please consider joining. We acknowledge all dual members at every SAL meeting. The fee for this honor is only \$10/year.

Often seen on the deck with the cigar society and other unofficial deck committee members, Bill Baker is usually called upon to settle factual disputes. When Bill is around, there is no real need to do a search on your phone.

Bill is a newly minted member of the SAL and is now a revered dual member here at Post 60. Having served from 1982 to 1988 in the Army National Guard and then the Air Force, Bill is also a 1982 graduate from the University of Pittsburgh Johnstown with a degree in chemistry. Bill's eligibility for the SAL comes from his father.

Staff Sgt Ronald E. Baker served in World War II as a turret gunner on a B-24 Liberator bomber, flying 30 missions and 47 sorties over the European theater. Bill still has his father's flight jacket and his personal log of missions which starts in August of 1944 and concludes in April of 1945; listing bombing missions over Italy, France, Germany, Austria, Romania and many more. He was part of the great Class of 46.



Bill did his basic training and most of his service at Lackland AFB in San Antonio, TX. He finished with the rank of Staff Sgt. in 1988. After his service he returned home to Pittsburgh but soon answered an ad for work here in the Baltimore/Washington area. Clean Harbors offered him a job similar to his Air Force training and duties. It has kept Bill here locally for the last thirty-seven years, managing the disposal of hazardous waste.

Besides his collection of baseball cards, estimated to be around 50,000, Bill enjoys the camaraderie of Post 60.
